






Seats-At-Risk-to-Margin Ratio High



DEMS DEFENDING MAJORITY OF CLOSE SENATE RACES








BUT... OUT-PARTY INCUMBENTS RARELY LOSE





- Continuing resolution expires
- Pres. Trump may veto spending bill that fails to significantly fund border wall.



Congress Must Increase Debt Ceiling in 2019, As PAYGO is Re-imposed & Trillion \$\$ Deficits Return






116th SENATE BY THE NUMBERS

- 22: Seats defended by Republicans (2 in Clinton '16 states: CO, ME) (4 in swing states: AZ, GA, IA, NC) (1 Majority Leader)

0: States split 2016 Sen/Pres. vote










Insurgent runs as "truer conservative" (Reagan 1976) (e.g. UN Amb. Nikki Haley, Sens. Ben Sasse, Marco Rubio, Ted Cruz)

Rockefeller Restoration

(Return of Kinder, Gentler)

1% likely



GOP turns to popular moderate with proven record (Eisenhower 1952) (e.g. Governors John Kasich, Larry Hogan or Charlie Baker)
